ABOUT SCOR®

ASCC has established the supply chain world's most widely accepted framework – the SCOR® process reference model – for evaluating and comparing supply chain activities and their performance. SCOR® can be used to describe supply chains that are very simple or very complex using a common set of definitions and enabling a common understanding. SCOR® lets companies quickly determine and compare the performance of supply chain and related operations within their company or against other companies.

Course participants will...

1. "Learn the SCOR language" and apply key building blocks of SCOR with focus on the use of the model in practice for supply chain optimization.
2. Discuss how to choose the right performance indicators to characterize supply chain performance, use standard metrics for benchmarking and performance improvement.
3. Assess best practices to determine supply-chain maturity.
4. Practice supply chain design with a case study during group work exercises.
5. Discuss several real life project examples, and experience how to organize and apply model and methodology to perform analysis and optimization in their own business environment.

Supply Chain Innovation: Blockchain for Supply Chains - Michael Ginap

The demand for transparency and traceability along the supply chain has increased over the years. This has led to an ever-growing digital penetration of business and operations processes.

Due to the rapidly increasing globalization and digitization of production and logistics processes (Industry 4.0 / IoT), supply chains become increasingly vulnerable; today, supply interruptions form one of the most significant corporate risks and ripple-on effects become paramount. Now more than 60% of the operational and supply chain interruptions are caused by IT failures. Two-thirds of these IT failures can be attributed to criminal cyber-attacks. But not only simple destructive cyber-attacks interfere with business processes, even deliberate data manipulation and data theft can be a threat to any business. Today's IT security standards no longer satisfy tomorrow's challenges of digital value webs. Wherever data need to be protected and saved in a secure manner an innovative non-vulnerable technology is required: "Blockchain".

The workshop will address some key questions:

- What is a "Blockchain"?
- What are the pro's and con's of using Blockchain technology?
- How do others use it in Supply Chain Management?
- (How) Can I use it?
